Leading and Managing Schools and Colleges

The University of Bath, UK, in conjunction with École Mondiale World School, Mumbai, India, offers an opportunity for qualified educators to participate in the University's MA in Education programmes. The full MA programme comprises five taught units and a dissertation. Each taught unit is followed by individual research and the submission of a 5000 word written assignment.

The unit to be taught in Mumbai will be **Leading and Managing Schools and Colleges**.

The aims of this unit, which is relevant to leaders, managers and teachers of all age ranges, are:

- to provide an overview of key concepts and issues connected with managing educational organisations in diverse contexts;
- to explore selected areas of management practice with reference to research, theory and professional experience;
- to foster students' critical reflection on the effectiveness and improvement of management practice in their experience

The fee for this 12 credit unit will be £675 for Home/EU registered students and £900 for Overseas registered students, payable in pounds sterling in advance. You may pay using a variety of methods (please see reverse side for details of payment methods).

An administrative charge of Rs 12,000 will be levied locally to cover tutor costs, refreshments and other relevant costs, and this should be paid direct to the school.
